It is with pleasure that I once again report to members on the operations of the Children's Leukaemia & Cancer Research Foundation (Inc) for the year ended June 30 2011.

Finance

It is most pleasing to report that for the year under review we once again had an outstanding year by returning an operational profit of \$1,131,307. I say outstanding because this result far exceeded the \$688,936 achieved in the previous financial year.

This is without doubt an excellent outcome in what has been a difficult financial climate and is significant as it is the first time we have passed that magical million dollar mark.

Whilst this is a very satisfactory financial position to be in we are, at the same time, very much aware of our ongoing funding commitments to both the triennial block grant as well as the additional \$1M Recognition of Excellence Grant, the CLCRF Fellowship and a future commitment of funding for the Woolworths WA Children's Leukaemia & Cancer Research Fellowship.

In respect to the specifics of overall financial position I will leave that to the Treasurer to report in greater detail regarding our operations for the past year.

Block Grant Funding

We have now completed the second year of the triennial block grant (2010 – 2012) titled "Novel Therapy for Steroid Resistant Paediatric Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia".

This is the 10th triennial Block Grant that the Foundation has funded and we are indeed extremely fortunate and very proud to have the talents of Professor Ursula Kees and her research team who continue to gain both local and international acclaim for their research achievements.

\$1M Recognition of Excellence Funding Grant

As previously reported, as a result of excellent peer group reviews, the Foundation was pleased to provide additional funding for a different research direction being research into "Leukaemogenesis and Novel Therapeutic Approaches".

We now enter our fifth year of this research and are delighted with both the progress and results of the research being undertaken.

CLCRF Fellowship

This Fellowship, valued at \$374,741 was awarded to Dr Alex Beesley to carry out research into "Targeting therapy and disease outcomes in Paediatric Cancer" and now enters its second of a three year time frame.

Professor Kees informs us that the research is going extremely well.

Woolworths WA Children's Leukaemia & Cancer Research Fellowship

In recognition of the outstanding support we have received from Woolworths I am pleased to report that a Fellowship to be known as the "Woolworths WA Children's Leukaemia & Cancer Research Fellowship" is to be funded at a cost of \$400K.

The Researcher/s to be appointed to this project will lead a team studying the fundamental biological processes that lead to the development of childhood cancer and searching for ways to improve cancer therapy.

Tele-Marketing Raffles

The Foundation has continued to undertake tele-marketing raffles. These continue to be successful, not only in a financial way, but in helping enhance our profile in the community.

During the period under review raffles 21, 22, 23, 24 and 25 were undertaken. Total revenue from these raffles totalled \$902,580 minus expenditure of \$561,418 leaving us with a profit of \$341,162. The amount also includes donations received via the raffles.

Donation Appeal Campaigns

Through the delivery of each raffle campaign the Foundation has been able to establish a database of donors in addition to raffle supporters. A donation appeal was sent to the donor database twice in 2010/11. The donation appeals have been based around a Xmas appeal and a Tax Time appeal. Research Program

Every year about 80 families in Western Australia are faced with the diagnosis of leukaemia or cancer in their child. The patients are treated at the Total Care Unit of Princess Margaret Hospital (PMH) and research over the past five decades has led to a steady improvement of survival rates, from less than 10% to more than 70% today. However, depending on the type of childhood cancer in each patient, cure rates vary significantly. Most patients at PMH receive therapy according to protocols developed by the US-based Children's Oncology Group (COG) since we are a member of this organisation. COG is the largest paediatric clinical trials group in the world, comprising more than 240 hospitals in America, Canada, Australia and Europe. Researchers, clinicians and the multi-disciplinary teams at each hospital work together to identify cancer causes and pioneer new therapies and cures.

The goal of the studies funded by the Children's Leukaemia & Cancer Research Foundation (Inc) (CLCRF) is the better understanding of childhood cancers and to translate this knowledge into new therapies. Our work focuses on patients with the most common form of cancer in children, acute lymphoblastic leukaemia or ALL. Of equal importance are the studies on brain tumours and a particular type of carcinoma called NUT midline carcinoma or NMC. The CLCRF funds are provided in three research programs, the triennial grant, the million dollar recognition grant and the CLCRF Fellowship to Dr Alex Beesley.

The ground-breaking work in the late 1950s led to better treatments for children diagnosed with ALL. Today patients who have a particular type of ALL can expect a cure in more than 90% of cases. However, resistance to therapy still occurs and leads to morbidity and mortality in children with ALL. In our current studies we examine drug resistance in ALL in order to design approaches to overcome it. We make use of cellular and molecular biology techniques, and through our close collaboration with the Total Care Unit we have access to specimens from patients diagnosed at PMH. Several thousands of specimens are stored in a large liquid nitrogen freezer, providing a very valuable asset for our studies. Since most specimens obtained are small, we developed a method to grow the leukaemia or cancer cells in the test tube, thus generating more material for studies. These cell lines are ideal models to examine the steps that lead to tumour growth and for the assessment of sensitivity to chemotherapeutic drugs. In our studies we have identified a drug that may overcome resistance in ALL to the widely used steroid drugs.

Childhood brain tumours are the leading cause of childhood cancer-related mortality, and survivors often suffer from significant intellectual and physical disabilities. Our studies focus on medulloblastoma and ependymoma, two of the most common types of paediatric brain tumour.

Many patients with ependymoma remain incurable, and although some progress has been made towards better treatment for medulloblastoma, there is an urgent need for more effective and less invasive strategies. Over the past twenty years we have established a panel of cell lines from patients diagnosed with brain tumours. They are an indispensable asset to study resistance to the very powerful drugs currently used to treat patients. Understanding the mechanisms the cancer cells develop in order to escape the actions of the drugs provides critical information for the design of better therapies. Studies are in progress to test candidate drugs in our model systems and we are employing novel preclinical mouse models to expedite the use of promising therapeutic agents in patients.

The diagnosis of carcinoma is rare in children and adolescents, yet over the past twenty years four young patients were diagnosed at PMH with a type of carcinoma called NMC that is almost uniformly lethal within months from diagnosis. We have generated three cell lines from the cancer cells of the patients, and this made it possible to investigate the underlying molecular genetic changes. Our current studies focus on the intricate molecular mechanisms that affect a particular gene called BRD4 and its role in the disease process in patients with NMC. We are testing the cell lines for their sensitivity to a large number of chemotherapeutic drugs in order to identify agents that may show activity against this type of carcinoma.

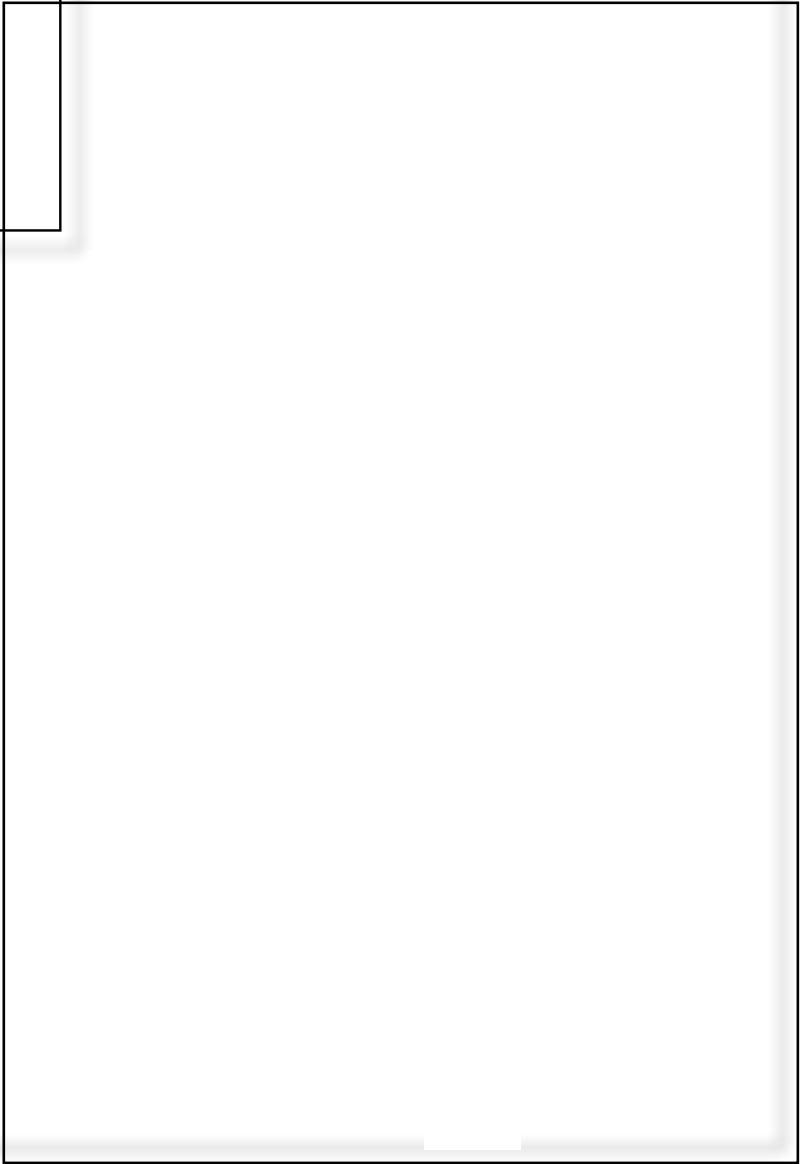
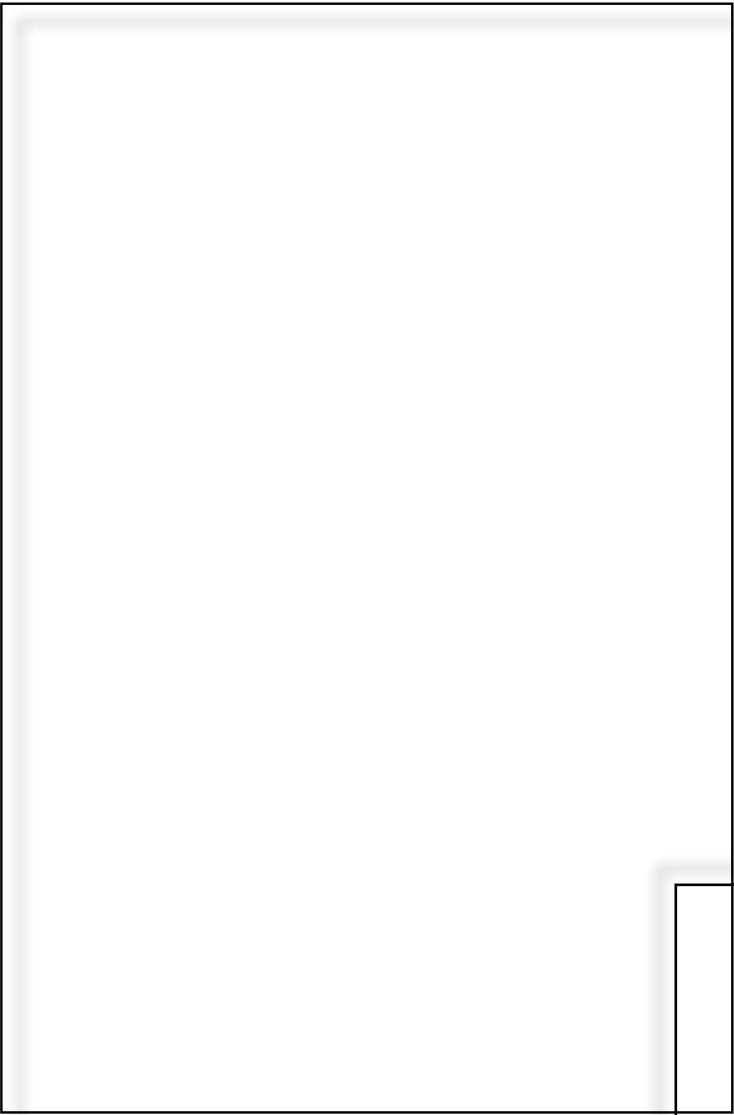
